(2) Signing of agreement with JACW



In June 2019, President YeonJin Chung and 7 representatives of KCWU attended the 70th Anniversary of JACW(Japanese National Association of Church Women) in Osaka, Japan. The JCWA-KCWU Mission Council has met and signed the agreement to exchange more active solidarity in the future.

(3) Planting Trees to Stop the Desertification in Mongolia

As a part of efforts to participate in the global ecological protection, 11 members of KCWU visited Mongolia in 2019 and donated 7,800 USD to The Grove of Grace project led by Korea Christian Environmental Movement Solidarity (KCEMS) since 2009 which plant trees to stop the desertification in Mongolia.



(4) Myanmar Covid-19 Emergency Medical Aid

In 2021, KCWU raised relief fund to help COVID-19 situation in Myanmar. 4,000 USD was donated to the Solidarity Fund for NCCK(The Korean Council of Christian Churches) to supply urgent medicines and vaccines for the treatment of COVID-19 in Myanmar.

(5) ACWC Day Worship Service

KCWU held ACWC Day Worship Service on the second Wednesday of December and prayed for ACWC, sisters of churches in Asia, the partner Country Taiwan.
